#### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

February 2024















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#### 1 INTRODUCTION

These Terms & Conditions apply to applicants ("Applicants") and participants ("Participants") in the Circular Culture Design School 2024 ("Program"). Please carefully read the following Terms & Conditions ("Terms") before applying to or participating in the Program, organized by ARIONA HELLAS S.A. (through ONASSIS ONX team) and the British Council of Athens ("Organisers"). By submitting an application, you acknowledge that you have read, understood, and unconditionally agree to all of these Terms and Conditions.

If you do not agree with any of these Terms, please refrain from applying to the Program.

#### 2 SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- The Program is open to thirty (30) participants from different disciplines within the creative industries, e.g. Creatives, Handcrafters, Architects, Artisans, Material Scientists, Product Designers, Crafters, Makers, Graphic Designers, UI/UX Designers, Visual Artists or other relevant discipline.
- One can participate as a representative of a legal entity, team or collective, by submitting the name of the entity (s)he represents and relevant proof of representation power.
- Only one (1) person can participate representing each legal entity, team or collective. In case of
  multiple applications of different persons for the same legal entity, the selection of one
  person/member representing such entity (the one with the highest score during the selection
  process) leads directly to the exclusion of others.
- This Open Call is addressed to natural persons, teams & companies residing or having registered
  offices in Greece. Selected legal entities will be requested to submit a document proving their
  company's registered office within a 5-day timeframe. Failure to provide the requested
  documentation within the specified timeframe may result in disqualification/exclusion from the
  selection process.
- Prior experience in design and knowledge of design tools is highly appreciated, though not required. Applicants must submit a sample of their previous works and demonstrate interest in participating in the Program.
- Proposed ideas and works-in-progress submitted by Applicants shall be assessed in terms of relevance with the learning outcomes of the Program and not upon their curatorial interest.
- There is no requirement for formal academic degrees of the Applicants and there are no age restrictions for Applicants.
- We seek to establish a safe and welcoming space that ensures participation of the widest range of participants. All spaces are wheelchair accessible.











#### APPLICATION

- Applicants are asked to submit their application via the official portal of the Onassis Foundation website, through an online application. Applications received by any other means will not be accepted and evaluated.
- Applications will remain open until the 13th of March 2024, at 12:00 noon, UTC+2.
- The application form and any other supportive material must be submitted in English. Applications and material submitted in any other language will not be accepted and evaluated.
- Each Applicant may submit only one (1) application. In the case of multiple applications, the first application only will be taken into consideration.
- In the application form, Applicants must indicate the Strand of their preference. Each applicant can apply in only one Strand. (Strand: The program consists of two focus groups on two distinctive thematic areas: a) "Materiality" and b) "Immateriality" in Circular Design, taking place simultaneously in different areas at Onassis Stegi. Most of the activities taking place during the Program will be accessible to the participants of one Strand or the other. The curriculum and the learning outcomes are designed specifically for each Strand and differ to each other.)

#### 3.1 APPLICATION FORM

In the online application form, Applicants are asked to provide:

- Contact Information
- **Personal Details**
- Portfolio

Note: If your work samples are time-based, ensure their duration is limited to 3 minutes or submit the 3minute excerpt you wish to be reviewed. In case you add a link of a locked file, please make sure that you also provide the password.

For both strands, applicants are asked to answer the following 3 obligatory questions:

- Why do you want to attend the CC Design School? What specific challenges or opportunities do you see in your local or professional context that the CC Design School can help address? Share your thoughts, concerns, or reasons of enthusiasm in terms of sustainability, circular materials, emerging technologies etc. based on the strand you selected. (max. 150 words) - 1000 characters
- What is your relevant experience with the selected strand? Mention practices, materials, technologies, tools etc. that you currently use in your projects. (max. 150 words) - 1000 characters
- How do you plan to apply the knowledge and skills gained from the CC Design School in your current or future projects? Do you have any specific idea that you plan to explore during and after the program? (max. 200 words) – 1250 characters







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Last but not least, applicants are asked to commit and attend in person the 4-day Program, as detailed in section 10 hereinbelow. The ability to attend the Program in person is a prerequisite for the acceptance of your application. By answering <u>no</u> in the below question of the online application, your application will not be reviewed and accepted for the Program.

 Are you committed to participating actively in all workshops, discussions, and collaborative activities throughout the entire 4-day program?

#### 4 SELECTION PROCESS

- The Program consists of 2 Strands (=focus groups) on the topics of: a) "Materiality" and b) "Immateriality" in Circular Design. 15 Participants will be selected for each Strand.
- Applicants are being evaluated separately, based on the Strand that they have selected.
- Participants selected following the selection process mentioned below shall execute the following documents:
  - o **if legal entities**: a) an agreement with the Organisers, in which each Participant will agree to receive the provided services by the Program, b) a "de minimis" declaration stating that it is eligible to receive the following mentoring/training support being part of an EU funded program.
  - If natural persons: an agreement with the Organisers, in which each Participant will
    commit to participating in the activities of the Program

#### 4.1 SELECTION PROCESS

The selection for the Program will be done in two (2) phases.

#### **PHASE I: SCREENING**

Here, each application will be received and initially reviewed by an Onassis ONX (Ariona) team member. The reviewer reviews all applications in order to ensure that the eligibility criteria stated in the present Terms& Conditions are fulfilled.

More specifically, the reviewer assesses (eligibility criteria):

- All required fields are correctly filled in.
- The Applicant is committed to fully attend physically the Program taking place at Onassis Stegi (107-109 Andrea Siggrou Avenue, Athens 117 45) from March 26<sup>th</sup> 29<sup>th</sup>, from 17:00 21:00 daily.
- Applicant's commitment to actively participate in all workshops, discussions, and activities during the aforementioned time period.
- Willingness to collaborate and contribute to the participating community.
- Acceptance of the present Terms & Conditions and Privacy Notice of the Program.

#### PHASE II: SHORTLISTING











In Phase II, the chosen applications, including the requested supporting materials, will be reviewed in detail by expert members of the ONASSIS ONX (Ariona) team and British Counsil team. ARIONA is responsible to collect all submissions and give access to team members of British Council in Athens as evaluators. The final selection is made jointly, based on the selection criteria as described below.

#### 4.2 SELECTION CRITERIA

- Clarity of intent, relevance to selected strand (Materiality Placemaking or Immateriality -World-Building), and applicant's goals alignment with Program's objectives.
- Uniqueness and innovation of the ideas or perspectives shared by applicants for their chosen
- Feasibility and potential impact of how the applicant plans to apply the knowledge and skills gained from the Program in their current or future projects.
- Quality, creativity, and relevance of the submitted portfolio to the chosen strand.
- Overall potential impact of the applicant's participation on their work and contribution to the Program's community.

#### It is expressly stated herein that:

- The criteria set out above shall all be taken into account jointly by the Organizing team (i.e. Onassis ONX (Ariona) and British Council), which shall, however, select the Participant freely, at their absolute discretion.
- The Organizing team is under no obligation to communicate the reasoning behind its choices or with regards to proposals that are rejected.
- Once the results have been announced, there shall be no re-evaluation of the submissions, and there can be no appeals.
- Each selected participant will be informed by March 19<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
- After the announcement of the selection results, selected Applicants must confirm their participation through completing an online participation form by the 21th of March, 12:00.
- No or delayed completion of the form gives the right to the Organisers to consider the application as withdrawn.
- In case a selected Applicant confirms his/her participation by any other means, the Organisers reserve the right to terminate participant's involvement in the Program.

- The working language of the Program is English. The application form and any other supportive
  material must be submitted in English. Participants are kindly requested to commit in the
  working language during the days of the Program.

- Participation in a 4-day workshop, led by expert UK tutors.
- Expert mentoring and guidance for works-in-progress by tutors and guest speakers.
- Opportunity to develop you own project.
- Opportunity to join an international network of makers/ creatives.

- Applicants retain full ownership over their prior information and intellectual property rights. By submitting their application, Applicants represent and warrant that they hold ownership of or have legally obtained a relevant license (in writing) to use all elements provided/submitted as part of their application and that the provided materials and information do not infringe any intellectual or other property rights, including patents, of any other persons, companies, or entities. Elements of the application that are based on rights held by others, such as patents, must be marked as such in the application.

- The Organizers will discuss, evaluate, share and in general process the information that you provide solely for the purposes and in the manner that are identified herein, namely for the purpose of reviewing and selecting Participants to the Program under the present Terms & Conditions. However, please refrain from including any proprietary or confidential information in your application.
- Your application to the Program does not create any kind of relationship between you and any of the Organisers, other than your agreement to this site's Terms of Use, and you won't receive any compensation for your application.

- The Organisers reserve the right to terminate a participant's involvement in the Program for failure to comply any with these Terms & Conditions.
