Having completed three stage works—*RELIC* (2015), *TITANS* (2017), and *ELENIT* (2019)—that continuously tour around the world, Euripides Laskaridis presented, first at Onassis Stegi, his new international co-production. Able to conjure magic from the most diverse and trifling materials, originator of a unique hybrid form of spectacle that spans the realms of performance, dance, and visual arts, seamlessly blending the sublime with the absurd, Euripides Laskaridis returns with the creation of another idiosyncratic performance, where elements of the grotesque, the comedic, and the terrifying, coexist. Continuing his ongoing exploration on the themes of transformation and ridicule, Laskaridis aims to craft anew a captivating and enigmatic world, intricately tailored to suit his peculiar, quirky, yet consistently endearing characters. The new work's title, Lapis Lazuli, draws inspiration from the semiprecious stone of the same name, renowned for its striking blue color.

Lapis lazuli is a metamorphic rock that exhibits unpredictable behavior under pressure. From the mask of Tutankhamun to the Renaissance paintings of Titian and Yves Klein's (post)modernist monochromatic works, lapis lazuli has graced a legion of artworks with its radiant and mysterious color.

In this new work, Euripides Laskaridis focuses on our existential relationship with fear and terror, seeking to explore a multitude of intriguing dualities, such as the material and the spiritual, the dreamlike and the nightmarish, the conscious and the subconscious, waving on stage a dense web of antitheses. These antitheses are also found—unexpectedly even for the creator/performer himself—within the very name of the stone, which draws its etymology from the conjunction of the Latin word 'lapis' (stone) and the Arabian 'lāzurd' (light blue), which accordingly derives from the Persian word 'lājevard' (heaven). Therefore, lapis lazuli is often rendered as the "Stone from Heaven".

Bio



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Euripides Laskaridis is a director and performer who engages with the notions of transformation and ridicule in his artistic practice, while his research is situated at the intersection of theater, dance, and visual arts. He studied acting at the "Karolos Koun" Art Theater in Athens and directing at the Brooklyn College in New York under a scholarship from the Onassis Foundation. As of 1995, he has been collaborating as a performer with directors such as Dimitris Papaioannou and Robert Wilson, among others, while in 2016 he was awarded the inaugural Pina Bausch Fellowship, which granted him the opportunity to collaborate closely with director and choreographer Lemi Ponifasio. In 2000, he began directing his own works for theater, while branching out into internationally acclaimed short films. In 2009, he founded the OSMOSIS performing arts company, a collaborative initiative to bring together artists that subscribe to a shared artistic vision. Euripides and OSMOSIS have presented their works in significant venues and festivals worldwide, such as the Athens Epidaurus Festival, Théâtre de la Ville in France, Julidans in the Netherlands, Hong Kong Arts Festival, Festival TransAmériques (FTA) in Canada, Lyon Biennale de la Danse, the Barbican Pit in London, the Israel Festival in Jerusalem, and the Public Theater in New York. Besides his endeavors as a performer and choreographer, Euripides has been invited to organize and lead workshops in institutions and dramatic arts schools across Europe, to share insights on his artistic practice.
