

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Coconuts cut in half, with their flesh removed. Washtubs filled with water. Bathroom plungers. Tap shoes. These are some of the objects employed by the two performers-orchestrators in "MOS" to produce sound.

Ioanna Paraskevopoulou, after being selected by the internationally recognized dance platform Aerowaves as one of the 20 most promising young makers of the year, continues her intensive presence abroad with her first choreographic work, "MOS," commissioned by Onassis Stegi. Immediately after the ONE Dance Week festival (Bulgaria), the Carlow Arts Festival (Ireland), the Atelier de Paris / CDCN / June Events Festival (France), and the 29th Kalamata Dance Festival, "MOS" keeps on its impressive journey across the stages of the world: from Italy to Norway, from England and the Dance Umbrella Festival at London's Barbican to Spain and the Otono Festival, among many others, to return, for just a few "collector's edition" nights at Onassis Stegi, where it all began.

"MOS" is a duet where the choreographer herself and her co-dancer Giorgos Kotsifakis enter into discourse with a disparate series of images and seek to impart their own transcription in space. The body and (micro-)movements co-exist with curious objects and materials to act as a means of sound production. The material is intensified, exploded, paused, repeated, and distorted in order to bolster the sound experience. Within the scenic formulation, individual pieces of information are teased out of the reused materials, thus inviting audience to generate new connections and interrelations. They find themselves successively transformed into listeners of a makeshift and heterogeneous soundtrack that unfolds before them. The performers become the intermediaries between the archive and the audience, offering up their own personal footage, composing their own sound adaptation of a non-linear cinematic script, and ultimately opting what could possibly be heard.

Ioanna Paraskevopoulou is a dancer and choreographer based in Athens. She graduated from the Greek National School of Dance and is currently studying at the Department of Audiovisual Arts, Ionian University, Greece. Her artistic practice focuses on the relationship between audiovisual media and movement. She has collaborated, among others, with Iris Karayan, Christos Papadopoulos, Dimitris Papaioannou, Alexandra Waierstall, Katerina S. Andreou, Lenio Kaklea, Sofia Mavragani, Tzeni Argyriou, Patricia Apergi, Andonis Foniadakis, Brendan Fernandes, Harry Koushos, "Ki omOs kineitai," and Maria Koliopoulou. She has been awarded the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Artist Fellowship ARTWORKS (2019). She created her choreographic video project "All She Likes Is Popping Bubble" Wrap" as part of the Onassis New Choreographers Festival 8, which was later awarded the Best Sound Design Award at the FIVideodanza Festival and the Best Video Art Award at the Maracay International Film & Video Festival (MIFVIF). She co-created the video dance piece "Battle of Fishes" in the context of the Miniatures for Revolution—GNO program. "Battle of Fishes" won the Best Cinematography Award in the context of the InShadow—Lisbon Screendance Festival. She presented "MOS" at the Onassis New Choreographers Festival 9. Also, she presented the 10minute piece "Coconut Effect" at the Danse Élargie competition, in which she won the Young Jury Award. "MOS" was selected by Aerowaves Twenty23 and continues to tour across international festivals.
