## Composition and the illusion of time and space

The word 'to compose' in Latin, 'componere', has nine meanings. In this lecture, I will focus only on one of these meanings, namely, 'to dissemble' (to give a false or misleading appearance to; to conceal the truth or real nature of).

With the explanation of an Arabic medieval theory as well as with the analysis of some Arabic scales (*maqamat*) and rhythms, I will explore some technical means which are capable to create for our perception the illusion of hearing various tempi. Through the recourse to some pieces of the solo cycle 'In Memoriam Escher' (II & III), I will demonstrate how the interplay of dynamics (pp, mp, f, etc.) -with no recourse to electronics- is apt to create virtual spaces for our perception.
