

## ***Life***

“A man and a woman spend time together” could be the sub-title of this most abstract of performances, which explores long-term co-existence through a series of shared everyday, seemingly mundane, moments.

What does it mean to spend a life with someone else? What does a couple share when they are together from the age of 25 to the end? Love? Routine? Desperation? The performance tries to retain life’s fleeting, suspended feel. On an empty stage, two actors dissect what we usually call “our life together”: the interaction down the decades between two human beings who choose to share their lives from carefree youth to old age. The spoken word is just one of the codes of communication they use, and it is not necessarily the most fundamental. What we observe on stage is the sharing of a few everyday moments which, on the face of it, seem neither stormy nor unusual in any way. And yet, our whole lives may ultimately be concealed in such seemingly insignificant moments. The passage of time emerges as a core axis of the performance. Rheumatism, the wear and tear wrought by time on the body, the changes in the sound it produces, how it looks at the other body, how and how much it speaks to it—all this becomes the material explored by the performance.

Giorgos Nousis is a graduate of the Drama School “Delos”–Dimitra Chatoupi, and is completing his degree at the National Technical University of Athens (School of Applied Mathematics and Natural Sciences).
